Recommendations for the 2022 Ruane Prize in Child and Adolescent Psychiatric Research

Dear Colleague:

The ***Ruane Prize for Outstanding Achievement in Child and Adolescent Psychiatric Research*** is a prize of \$50,000 given by the Brain & Behavior Research Foundation to an outstanding scientist carrying out research on the causes, pathophysiology, treatment or prevention of severe child psychiatric illness. The scientist to be recognized is one who gives particular promise for advancing our understanding of psychotic, affective or other severe psychiatric disorders having their onset in childhood or adolescence.
